

Russian Documentary Film Festival

The Third Annual Russian Documentary Film Festival in New York will be held at Tribeca Cinemas September 30 through October 3, 2010.

This year the festival will include a varied program of new documentaries by filmmakers in Russia and the Russian Diaspora in the US.

Films of different genres, filled with concern and angst over the fate of humanity in today's world will be shown together with profiles of prominent artists and writers, and reports about everyday life in Russia.

This year, film director Andrei Tarkovsky, writer Yuz Aleshkovsky, poet Naum Korzhavin, conductor Valery Gergiev, and sculptor Ernst Neizvestny have been placed into the spotlight.

Among the directors coming to New York are Russian filmmakers Sergei Miroshnichenko (*Twilight of the Gods*, *Yuz*, *Jazz*, *Irka and the Dog*), Aleksei Burykin (*18 Seconds*), Angelina Golikova (*Encounter*), Alexander Gurjanov (*State of the Moment*), Elena Yakovich (*Ernst Neizvestny's Bronze Age*), and Russian Americans Dmitry Khavin (*Across the Narrow Bridge*) and Dmitry Trakovsky (*Meeting Andrei Tarkovsky*).

The Russian Documentary Film Festival in New York was founded by *The New Review, Inc.* (USA). The festival is being held with the help of a generous grant from the *Ruskiy Mir Foundation* (Russia), as well as financial and logistical support from the *Consulate General of the Russian Federation in New York*; *Panorama Travel*; *COJECO*; the *Russian Nobility Association in America*; *Princess Diana Bagrationi*; *Alex Soldier*; *Peter Tcherepnine*; *VK Studio*; *Victor Lazuchin*, the *Liberty Award*, *Peter Oudolsky*, and the *Sovereign Order of the Orthodox Knights Hospitallers*.
